

Support at Home Classifications

Support at Home has eight funding classifications, which means your care can be more closely matched to your individual needs. Below, we outline the different classifications and the types of support each provides.

| 1 | \$2,682.75 | \$10,731.00 | Minimal support - Light housework, meal delivery and welfare check-ins. For largely independent individuals. |
| 2 | \$4,008.61 | \$16,034.45 | Light personal care - Assistance with dressing, showering, medications and social activities. |
| 3 | \$5,491.43 | \$21,965.70 | Moderate support - Regular personal care, mobility aid support, meal preparation and household cleaning. |
| 4 | \$7,424.10 | \$29,696.40 | High-frequency support - Assistance with daily routines, home modifications, toileting and continence care. |
| 5 | \$9,924.35 | \$39,697.40 | Daily support & health coordination - Assistance with hoists and transfers, transport to medical appointments and in-home safety monitoring. |
| 6 | \$12,028.58 | \$48,114.30 | Comprehensive care - Nursing support (wound care, medication), continence management and allied health therapies. |
| 7 | \$14,537.04 | \$58,148.15 | Intensive daily care - Assistance with all daily living activities, complex health conditions and dementia support. |
| 8 | \$19,526.59 | \$78,106.35 | Highest level of care - Palliative support, 24/7 availability, specialised equipment and nursing care at home. |

How are Support at Home Classifications determined?

Your first step is to contact My Aged Care, the national gateway to aged care services. Call **1800 200 422** or visit **myagedcare.gov.au**. They will ask a few simple questions about your health, mobility, and how you are managing day-to-day. Assessments consider physical health, mobility, cognitive function, living arrangements, and support networks.

You can always request for reassessment if your circumstances change - for example, after recovery or illness progression.
