You should know that...

• each item must be less than \$1500



• if your consumables budget is agencymanaged, you can only buy consumables from a registered NDIS provider



• low cost assistive technology is also included in this budget. That means smaller items that help you in your daily life.



• you need to make sure the items you purchase are reasonable and necessary, and are needed because of your disability



• the items in this list are just an example there are many more things you can purchase with your NDIS consumables funding!





Continence Aids

- pull ups and nappies
- catheters
- colostomy bags
- waterproof bedding
- wipes
- barrier cream

Hearing/Visual Aids

- handheld magnifier
- bed shaker alarm
- flashing doorbell
- talking clock
- visual smoke alarm
- walking stick

Physical Aids

- easy tipping kettle
- shower stool/chair
- grab rails
- modified cutlery
- non-slip mats
- portable ramps

Wound Care/Medical

- syringes
- feeding tubes and bags
- thickeners
- pressure sore care
- PPE (personal protective equipment)

Cognitive/Sensory Aids

- zip sheets
- sensory chewing aids
- noise cancelling headphones
- large print labels

Technology

- apps for making social stories
- text-to-voice software
- smart watch
- Google home
- reader pen
